Intermediate	Can use more complex grammatical structures and vocabulary expressing the specific differences between tenses. Can express personal views, make deductions and talk about imaginary situations using related vocabulary and structures properly.	Can state the main ideas and understand, sequence and classify specific information in relatively authentic reading texts. Can make inferences and use the words inferred from contextual clues in different situations.	Can identify the overall organization of a paragraph and write coherent, cohesive and unified paragraphs. Can analyze and understand the structure of five paragraph opinion essays and write accurate thesis statements. Can analyze and report statistical data in an organized way.	Can express opinions and personal views on a wide range of topics using critical thinking skills. Can take notes on academic-related topics to find the main ideas and some details in a lecture.
