## Announcement on Remedial Examinations (tek ders/iki ders sınavları) of SoFL 1101 – English for Academic Purposes I

Students who will take the remedial examination must complete all the assessment tasks listed below:

- **1- Listening Exam:** The listening exam of 60 minutes will be in largely the same format as the SOFL 1101 midterm exam.
- **2- Presentation:** The presentation of 4-5 minutes will be in largely the same format as the SoFL 1101 2<sup>nd</sup> Graded Presentation. A topic will be provided and the student will do research and refer to their findings in the presentation.
- **3- Final Exam (reading):** The final exam of 90 minutes will be in largely the same format as the SOFL 1101 final exam.

## The distribution of grades is as follows:

Listening exam : 40%
Presentation : 20%
Final exam : 40%

## **General information:**

- Students will be assessed for the following skills in the listening exam: note-taking, identifying main idea(s) and supporting evidence.
- Students will be assessed for reading skills in the final exam.
- The listening exam, the presentation and the final (reading exam) exam may take place on the same day but this will be announced to the student. A break will be given after each exam.
- Students will have 60 minutes to complete the listening exam and a further 90 minutes to complete the final exam (reading).
- In the presentation of 4-5 minutes, students are asked to refer to texts based on arguments they develop, incorporating stance & evidence and premise & conclusion elements extracted from pre-researched sources. Students need to use appropriate presentation software. The use of visual aids is compulsory (PowerPoint). Students who fail to use visual aids can score a maximum of 60 out 100 (but may score less). Students must also fill in the source analysis form and submit it to an instructor in charge before the presentation.

• Grading will be completed using the rubrics and guidelines from the EAP program.
