

Announcement on Remedial (tek ders/iki ders) Examinations of SoFL 1102 – English for Academic Purposes II

Students who will take the remedial examination must complete all the assessment tasks listed below:

1- **Written exam:** The written exam of 90 minutes will be in largely the same format as the SOFL 1102 midterm exam.

2- **Essay:** You will complete an essay in the same format as the SOFL 1102 written assessment to answer a question provided in the assessment.

3- **Oral exam:** You will be required to speak with an EAP instructor about your essay, defending your ideas using academic language and referring to the research you have been provided on the topic. The assessment will take around 5 minutes.

The distribution of grades is as follows:

Written exam	: 40%
Essay	: 50%
Oral exam	: 10%

Information on the essay:

Using the sources provided, you will produce an essay. You are expected to include accurate in-text citations and a list of references using APA guidelines (the list of references is not included in the word limit).

Please note: You are NOT entitled to attend the exam with a pre-written assignment – the essay must be written during the exam.

You will be given 120 minutes to produce the essay.

The essay should be between 500 - 1000 words.

Further general information:

- The written exam, the essay and the oral exam may take place on the same day but this will be announced to the student. A break will be given between them. The oral exam may take place at a later time agreed between the teacher and student.
- Students will have 90 minutes to complete the written exam and a further 120 minutes to produce their essay. Students will be required to speak between 3-5 minutes for the oral exam.
- Students may use hard copy dictionaries to complete the essay and written exam.
- Students must reference the sources they have been provided in their essays.
- The proctor will be responsible for monitoring the use of materials etc and for making sure no pre-written essays are used.
- Grading will be completed using the related writing rubrics and guidelines from the EAP program.
